## SPELLING BONANZA

## AMESA (Association for Mathematics Education of South Africa) MATHS CHALLENGE

This Mathematics Challenge is a multiplechoice paper and all Grade 4 to 7 girls participate in the First Round. Girls may choose to enter individually or with a partner for this. According to results, girls will progress to further rounds.


## SCHOOL TOURS

Sleepover tours are organised once a year for the Grade 4 to 7 girls. Detailed letters and indemnity forms are sent home to parents prior to the respective camps. Grades 5 to 7 camps/tours are held in the second term and the Grade 4 camp is held during the third term. Teachers accompany the girls, and much fun and adventure is appreciated by everyone.

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## APPS SCIENCE FAIR

After much research on a chosen topic and learning to conduct a scientific investigation, Grade 6 girls will participate in this annual event and present their projects to outside adjudicators, pupils across the grades and interested parents. According to the results, the top projects are selected and are entered into the Eskom Science Expo for Young Scientists. This experience exposes the girls to a range of investigations, increasing their awareness of the wonders of science, adding to their knowledge and broadening their scientific horizons.


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## SCHOOL PLAY

Where does one start? The Senior Play, for Grade 4 to 7 girls, is a production not to be missed. This play is presented skillfully through wellrehearsed characterisation, movement and musical items by a cast who, without exception, are superb. The bar is set high right from curtain-up and you will be held captivated. Several performances take place and Grade 7 girls play leading roles, with ensemble played by Grade 4 to 6 girls. Tickets are sold quickly, so watch the dates for the booking week for your grade.
